Eastern Zone May Meeting Report May 4th, 2013 Ft. Lauderdale, FL

Athlete Requirements to attend Convention-

The USAS athlete committee has developed new guidelines for athletes attending convention. Proposals of new requirements were presented to the Board at the April meeting. The recommendations for change were accepted and endorsed by the board. The requirements for minor athlete travel to convention will go into effect this year.

Attached is a copy of the Athlete requirements. LSC General Chairs and Permanent offices are to support the effort to ensuring that all athletes have proper paperwork completed & turn in PRIOR to attending convention.

Zones are asked to encourage and assist in shared services programs (room sharing, chaperones, etc.) for athletes attending convention. Each athlete will have a designated chaperone from their home LSC for all athletes less than 18 years of age. Any athlete attending convention on a National Committee will be supervised by their home LSC.

The last proposal by the Athlete committee is athletes traveling to a committee meeting must attend with a parent. The current proposal states that costs associated with travel for USA Swimming or the LSC cover the parent.

Recommendation to move Board of Review to Zone Level-

Attached is the report from the task force regarding BOR. The recommendation is to move BOR of to the Zone level. The reasoning for this change is to remove an appearance of conflict of interest from the LSC of which the BOR action occurred.

This recommendation was endorsed by the USAS Board and will be apart of the 2013 legislation. Should this pass it would be implemented in 2014.

This recommendation posse a couple of questions that will need to be addressed by the Zone. Should the proposal pass, funding for BOR actions will either have to be provided by the Zone or by the LSC in which the BOR originated.

This proposal will be discussed at the Eastern Zone General Chairs meeting.

The second recommendation of the task force was to move to a permanent pool of BOR members. These members would serve a "term" similar to committee positions. The members would rotate service based on years and would serve a term of 2 years.

Eastern Zone May Meeting Report May 4th, 2013 Ft. Lauderdale, FL

USA Swimming Foundation & Make A Splash-

The USA Swimming foundation continues to grow and have banner years. May is National drowning awareness month. Some of the events planned are on May 16th; the Empire State Building will be lit in blue light to recognize Make a Splash and drowning prevention.

Several tour stops are planed for the next year. A complete list of tour stops will be available soon.

In May, the foundation will visit Capitol Hill in Washington, DC to talk about how to help in drowning prevention. Accidental drowning is still the leading cause of accidental death in children under the age of 7.

Membership Dues Increase Recommendation-

As noted in Chuck Weilgus' report, the growth of USA Swimming is strong and steady. Though many attribute this to the post Olympic boom, we are exceeding our membership projections for 2013. While growth is welcomed, we know that with growth also come additional expenses for programming, staff, membership services, etc.

The current structure of dues increase of \$1.00 per year will expire in 2015. The board has endorsed a recommendation that starting in 2015 dues increase of \$2.00 per year (4%) through 2025 (10 years). This recommendation will apart of the delegate package in September.

FINA Change to Breaststroke Rule-

The Breaststroke rule change will go before the FINA congress this summer. The current working for the rule change is:

At the start the swimmer will be required to take one stroke that may be all the way back to the legs. A breaststroke kick must be done prior to the break of the water. There is no limit to the amount of fly kicks that can be done. The swimmer must surface by the 15M mark. There must be a stroke and kick within the first 15M.

Masters Swimming Coaches-

USA Masters informed the Board that all Masters coaches must now be registered with USA Masters to be eligible to coach. USA Swimming coach's certification will no longer count for insurance purposes with USA Masters.

Sanctioning Task Force-

The sanctioning task for presented their report and recommendations for Sanctioning rules. After consulting with LSC's all over the country the task force has recommended an "open market" structure. The recommendation does allow for LSC's to limit the number meets on weekends & meets that would conflict with LSC meets.

The task force also recommended an appeal process at the Zone level for a club that is denied a sanction.

The board endorsed the recommendations of the task force and final legislation proposals are being drafted and will be submitted prior to the May 15th deadline.

2016 Olympic Trials Host

The USA Swimming Board unanimously endorsed the 2016 Olympic Trails returning to Omaha. USA Swimming Assistant Executive Director, Mike Unger, presented the choice to the board after long and complex review by the panel at USA Swimming reviewing the bids.

The Eastern Zone's own, Jim Wood, was apart of the selection process for the 3rd time! Thank you Jim for your hard work in ensuring that the 2016 trials will be the best yet.

2016 trials cuts will be released in mid-late 2014.

This memo is being sent to you in advance of the April 27th board meeting to provide a general update on a wide range of activities, issues and programs that currently have our attention at the national office. There is a full agenda for the board meeting, so please try to find some time prior to the meeting to review this memo, and do not hesitate to contact me or any of the staff division directors if you have questions or desire more information about anything referenced in this memo.

MEMBERSHIP

Members are the lifeblood for every NGB, and membership growth is a primary factor toward ensuring long-term organizational health. For 30 years, our athlete membership growth has been on a steady rise, and there are no indications that this growth will subside in years to come. The analysis of statistics can sometimes become overwhelming, which is why I thought it might be interesting simply to look at our athlete membership growth over the past ten years, since the advent of the dues increase in 2004.

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT & EVENTS

<u>2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials</u>: The 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials event was nominated for "Best Sports Event of the Year" by the *Sports Business Journal*. The other three finalists include the Ryder Cup, Stanley Cup and the U.S. Grand Prix (Formula 1). The sixth annual Sports Business Awards will be handed out during a ceremony on May 22 at the New York Marriott Marquis at Times Square.

<u>2016 U.S. Olympic Team Trials</u>: Following a long and thorough study and selection process, we will be asking you to endorse our recommended host city for the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team Trials. A detailed presentation will be made at the board meeting.

<u>Call Me Maybe?</u> The *Call Me Maybe* video was selected as an official honoree in The 17th Annual Webby Awards in the viral category. The official honoree distinction is awarded to the top 15% of all work entered that exhibits remarkable achievement of the more than 11,000 entries. You can find more at <u>http://winners.webbyawards.com/2013/online-film-video/general-film-categories/viral/honorees</u>.

<u>SwimToday</u>: The latest update to the SwimToday White Paper was distributed to suit manufacturers, retailers, other non-profit organizations and more March 25. This update takes all of the initial brainstorming and narrows it down to a more streamlined direction for the campaign that will focus on moms with kids, with an emphasis on multicultural outreach. <u>Deck Pass</u>: We currently have a total of 120,000 users. From Sept. 1-April 2, we have added 41,000 users. As the summer season begins we have started a campaign to have Deck Pass promoted with summer leagues around the country in heat sheets and programs. Our goal is to encourage summer league swimmers to use the non-member functionality within the app including tracking times, setting goals and connecting with friends. In an effort to increase revenue, we have created a pilot with team dealer Kast-A-Way that that highlights Deck Pass pins (lapel pins vs. virtual pins) coming soon. Merchandise will include taggoggles, bag tags and iron-on patches.

<u>Swimmers in the Community:</u> The 2012-13 swIMPACT program has added seven post-NCAA eligibility athletes; we now have 37 participating athletes. To date, these athletes have made more than 40 appearances across the country in helping to promote the sport.

<u>Family & Friends Program</u>: USA Swimming's Family & Friends program is gearing up for the FINA World Championships this summer (swim dates July 28-August 4, 2013) in Barcelona, Spain. USA Swimming has secured a block for family and friends attending. If you are interested in purchasing tickets contact Jim Fox at <u>jfox@usaswimming.org</u>. <u>Matt Farrell to speak at Paris Conference</u>: Matt has been invited to make a presentation at the "Connected Sport Conference" in Paris on May 16. The conference is hosted by *SportBusiness,* an international trade publication similar to the *Sports Business Journal* here in the U.S.. Matt's presentation will focus on the Aqua Zone at our Olympic Trials and how technology and social media served to enhance the visitor experience.

New staff additions to the Business Development & Events team:

- John Martin will serve as our Sports Communications Manager. John's work will focus on communication related to our key events, as well as promotion of both our National Team athletes and the sport of swimming as a whole. John comes to USA Swimming from USA Triathlon, where he served as Communications & Media Relations Manager for the past three years. Prior to joining USA Triathlon in 2010, John worked for six years at the University of North Carolina (his alma mater) as a part of the Athletic Communications staff. John is a graduate of the University of North Carolina.
- **Dana Bonner** will serve as Marketing Manager. She will oversee the marketing and promotional elements of swIMPACT. Additionally, she will manage programs to help clubs promote themselves. She will focus on Deck Pass and SwimToday in particular. Dana comes to us from GMR, an engagement marketing agency, where she oversaw experiential marketing for the smart car USA account for Mercedes-Benz. She also has been a marketing manager and coach for a USA Gymnastics club and worked with the NBA's New Jersey Nets for four seasons on their sponsorship team. Dana graduated from the University of Miami (Fla.).
- **Tommy Schield** will be our new Organizational Communications Specialist. In his role, Tommy will work to promote USA Swimming as an organization. He'll focus on communication related to our programs, will work to promote our executive team, and will also actively promote swIMPACT appearances. Tommy received his bachelor's degree in public relations from Illinois State University. As an undergraduate, he worked in the athletic communications department at Illinois State and then worked for a year at Conference USA after his graduation. He attended graduate school at Angelo State University in Texas, earning his master's degree in communication. Most recently, Tommy spent eight months in the communications department at the United States Olympic Committee.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT

<u>Foundations of Coaching Course Revision</u>: The first half of the Foundations of Coaching revision, the 101 course, launched in February. Comments about the content and design of the 101 course have been very positive. To date, over 500 new coaches have taken this revised course as a part of their new coach requirement. The second half of the course, Foundations 201, required before 2nd year coach registration, has a target launch date of June 1, 2013. The 201 course is similar to the 101 course in design with video, narrated informational slides and interactive learning, but the 201 course is much more extensive and comprehensive. It will require approximately 4-5 hours of online learning time

followed by a test. The developer, ePath Learning, has done a wonderful job in both developing the courses and providing ongoing support while we work out the minor technical bugs inherent in any launch. The third aspect of the education requirement, a Rules and Regulations test, is already active on the USA Swimming website. By the end of 2013, the transition to the new coaching requirement will be complete and the current DVD based course and test will no longer be offered.

<u>Coach-Owner Seminar</u>: USA Swimming's Club Development Division will host the first-ever Coach-Owner Seminar at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs April 26-29. 35 coaches have registered to hear presenters Chuck Batchelor of Bluefish Swim Club, Mike Koleber of Nitro Swimming, and Bill Schalz of Academy Bullets. Topics will include motivation, planning, process, pitfalls, working models, and club operations.

<u>2013 Open Water Select Camp</u>: On June 4-8, USA Swimming will conduct the 2013 National Open Water Select Camp in Fort Myers, FL. This camp is a unique opportunity to introduce accomplished pool distance swimmers to Open Water swimming. Since inception, a high percentage of finalists in the annual 5K and 10K Open Water National Championships have been participants in this camp program. 24 athletes have been selected for the 2013 camp. The camp will include long course workouts, salt water workouts and fresh water workouts in addition to educational sessions. The athletes will also participate in a local 5K event as part of the camp experience. April has been an exceptionally busy month for the National Team staff. Following are just some of the recent activities that have been taking place.

- On the first weekend of the month, we hosted 90 Junior Team athletes and coaches at the training Center for a Junior Team Camp.
- The Sports Medicine Network held its annual meeting here at the OTC on April 12-13 and there were 40 attendees. The feedback was that this was the best annual meeting ever held by the group.
- The Women's Leadership Conference was held April 14-16 and 30 female coaches participated. These coaches also had the opportunity to join the portions of the National Team Coaches meetings.
- The National Team Coaches Conference was held April 15-17 and 117 National Team and Junior National Team coaches were in attendance. By all accounts, it was an exceptional gathering of our nation's most elite coaches.

ATHLETE REPRESENTATIVES HONOR CODE

Duration: April 28, 2013 - October 31, 2013

As an athlete member of USA Swimming Committee(s), I understand and will comply with the following rules, as set forth by the USA Swimming Athletes Executive Committee and adopted by the USA Swimming Board of Directors, at all times while serving as an athlete representative for USA Swimming. A signature on this document constitutes unconditional agreement to comply with the stipulations of the document.

General Rules:

- a. Athletes will adhere to the USA Swimming Code of Conduct.
- b. Athletes will display proper respect and sportsmanship toward committee members, athletes, USA Swimming staff and the public at all times.
- c. When using social media, attending meetings, and traveling for meetings, athletes are representing both themselves and USA Swimming. Athlete behavior must positively reflect the high standards of the sport.
- d. Athletes are to refrain from use of inappropriate language.

Travel Rules:

- e. Athlete Representatives Travel Policy; Athlete Representatives Authorizations, Release, Waiver Form; and Athlete Representatives Medical Treatment Authorization & Consent must be executed by the athlete and parent/guardian (if applicable) and on file with USA Swimming.
- f. Athletes will not commit any illegal act and will refrain from any inappropriate behavior that would detract from a positive image of USA Swimming or be detrimental to its objectives.
- g. The possession or use of alcohol, tobacco products, or controlled substances by any minor athlete is prohibited at all times, including travel to and from and for the duration of all committee meeting(s).
- h. The possession, use, or sale/distribution of any controlled or illegal substance or any form of weapon is strictly forbidden.
- i. Athletes are to refrain from inappropriate physical contact during committee meeting travel.
- j. Athletes will attend all meetings, educational sessions, and related events, unless excused for good cause by the Athletes Executive Committee or the related Committee Chair.

Disciplinary Action:

Failure to comply with the Athlete Representatives Honor Code as set forth in this document may result in disciplinary action. Such discipline may include, but may not be limited to:

- i. Dismissal from a trip and immediate return home at the athlete's expense;
- ii. Denial of travel reimbursement;
- iii. Other financial penalties;
- iv. Suspension from one or more future committee meetings;
- v. Dismissal from the committee(s); and/or

vi. Proceedings before a USA Swimming National Board of Review.

Disciplinary action shall be the responsibility of the USA Swimming Athletes Executive Committee. The USA Swimming Athletes Executive Committee shall have the right to establish and use one or more systems to determine if all aspects of the Rules of Conduct have been followed by national committee athletes and will provide the subject athlete with at least the opportunity for a hearing after proper notice. Any appeal following any disciplinary action shall be in accordance with Part Four of the USA Swimming Rules and Regulations to the National Board of Review.

TRAVEL POLICY FOR ATHLETE REPRESENTATIVES (18 Years and Older)

Duration: April 28, 2013 – October 31, 2013

As an athlete member of the USA Swimming National Committee(s) set forth below, I understand and will comply with the following policies:

"National Committee Travel" by an athlete member is defined as any travel to a USA Swimming national committee, subcommittee or task force meeting or workshop, or to the annual USA Swimming Convention.

Applicable Policies:

- a. Athlete Representatives Travel Policy (18 Years and Older); Athlete Representatives Authorization, Release & Waiver; and Athlete Representatives Medical Treatment Authorization & Consent must be executed by each athlete and be on file with USA Swimming prior to any National Committee Travel.
- b. A current copy of the **Athlete Representatives Honor Code** must be executed by the athlete and on file with USA Swimming.
- c. During overnight National Committee Travel, the athlete shall room (i) with an athlete of similar age, when reasonably possible, and if not reasonably possible, placed in a single room (i.e., without a roommate), and (ii) always with an athlete of the same gender (if sharing a room).
- d. The athlete should carry proof of their personal medical insurance with them at all times during National Committee Travel.
- e. Athletes shall attend all meetings and any related functions unless otherwise excused for good cause by the Committee Chair.
- f. During National Committee Travel, athletes shall:
 - a. Be quiet and respect the rights of committee members and other guests in the hotel;
 - b. Be punctual for all meetings and other activities, and dress appropriately;
 - c. Use good taste when accessing and posting to social media;
 - d. Respect travel vehicles;
 - e. Use appropriate behavior in public facilities;
 - f. Stay in the assigned hotel room; and
 - g. Acknowledge that the needs and interests of USA Swimming come first.
- g. During National Committee Travel, athletes are responsible for any:
 - a. Incidental charges at the committee meeting or hotel; and
 - b. Any damages or lost property at the committee meeting or hotel.

TRAVEL POLICY FOR ATHLETE REPRESENTATIVES (Minor Athletes)

<u>Duration</u>: April 28, 2013 – October 31, 2013

As a minor athlete member and parent of a minor athlete member, respectively, of USA Swimming, we understand and agree to comply with the following USA Swimming policies. Signatures on this document constitute unconditional agreement to comply with the stipulations of the document.

"USA Swimming Travel" is defined as travel to a USA Swimming National Committee or subcommittee meeting or workshop (each, a "Committee Meeting"), or to the USA Swimming annual convention. USA Swimming Travel by a minor athlete must be supervised by a designated committee member, LSC adult member, or parent/guardian of the athlete (each, a "Supervisor").

Section 1 – Policies for both the Athlete & Supervisor

- 1. Athlete Representative Travel Policy for Minor Athletes; Athlete Representatives Authorization, Release & Waiver; and Athlete Representatives Medical Treatment Authorization & Consent must be signed and agreed to by the athlete and parent/guardian and on file with USA Swimming.
- 2. For each Committee Meeting, or the annual USA Swimming convention, attended by an athlete member under 18 years of age that reauires travel. the athlete must complete the **Travel Authorization for Minor Athletes** form, which must indicate the Supervisor (a parent or guardian, a designated committee member, or a designated LSC athlete supervisor) who will be responsible for the athlete during the USA Swimming Travel. The form must be completed for each Committee Meeting and submitted to the Committee Chair prior to making travel arrangements.
 - a. For Committee Meetings occurring other than during or incident to the annual USA Swimming Convention:
 - i. If a parent/guardian is designated as the responsible party, the parent/guardian must travel with the athlete to and from the Committee Meeting, and the reasonable travel costs (in accordance with USA Swimming's standard travel policies) for one parent or guardian will be the responsibility of the committee.
 - ii. If a committee member or LSC athlete supervisor will be responsible for the athlete, that individual will be responsible for the athlete from the time the athlete arrives at the destination hotel or location of the meeting until the athlete departs for the airport to return home.

- b. For the Annual USA Swimming Convention:
 - i. The Supervisor shall be designated by the athlete's LSC. All travel and related expenses will be the responsibility of the athlete's LSC.
 - ii. A parent/guardian may choose to travel to the annual USA Swimming Convention as their child's Supervisor; however, neither USA Swimming nor the athlete's LSC will be responsible for the parent's/guardian's travel expenses.
- 3. Regardless of gender, a Supervisor shall not share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with an athlete (unless the Supervisor is the parent, guardian, or sibling of that particular athlete).
- 4. When only one athlete and one Supervisor travel to a Committee Meeting, the athlete must have his or her parent's or legal guardian's written permission in advance to travel alone with the Supervisor.
- 5. When a minor athlete is not traveling with a parent or guardian during USA Swimming Travel, the athlete shall always room with athletes of a similar age, when reasonably possible, and always with an athlete of the same gender; when an athlete cannot room with another athlete of the same gender, the athlete will have a single room and no roommates.
- 6. Athletes should not ride in a Supervisor's vehicle without another adult present who is the same gender as the athlete, unless prior written parental permission is obtained.
- 7. Curfews shall be established by the Supervisor each day of the trip.
- 8. The directions and decisions of the Supervisor are final.
- 9. The Supervisor should carry a signed **Athlete Representatives Medical Treatment Authorization & Consent Form** for each athlete.

Section 2 – Policies for the Athlete

- 1. To ensure the propriety of the athletes and to protect the committee members or LSC members, there will be no males in a female's room and no females in a male's room at any time (unless the other athlete is a sibling of that particular athlete).
- 2. Athletes will attend all meetings and any related functions unless otherwise excused or instructed by the Supervisor or Committee Chair.
- 3. Athletes may not leave the meeting venue or any other place at which the committee or LSC has gathered without the permission of the Supervisor.
- 4. When visiting public places such as shopping malls, movie theatres, etc. the athlete will stay in a group of no less than three people.
- 5. *Behavior*. During overnight USA Swimming Travel, athletes shall:
 - i. Be quiet and respect the rights of committee members and other guests in the hotel;
 - ii. Be punctual for all meetings and other activities, and dress appropriately;
 - iii. Use good taste when accessing and posting to social media;
 - iv. Respect travel vehicles;
 - v. Use appropriate behavior in public facilities;
 - vi. Stay in the assigned hotel room; and
 - vii. Acknowledge that the needs and interests of USA Swimming come first.

- 6. *Financial.* During overnight USA Swimming Travel, athletes are responsible for any:
 - i. Incidental charges at committee meeting or hotel; and
 - ii. Damages or thievery at committee meeting or hotel.

Section 3 – Policies for the Supervisor. The Supervisor shall be:

- a. Assigned and shall assume responsibility for the minor athlete for the entire duration of the Committee Meeting or USA Swimming convention;
- b. The point of contact in an emergency situation to committee members and USA Swimming staff;
- c. Provided athlete's personal medical insurance and emergency contact information prior to the beginning of the meeting and shall keep such information available throughout the duration of the meeting;
- d. Responsible for communicating travel reimbursement information and policies to the athlete;
- e. Responsible for ensuring that the athlete is not participating in unsafe or unsupervised activities;
- f. Aware of meetings, swim practice, and sponsored events that the athlete is scheduled to attend;
- g. Be responsible for checking-in with athlete multiple times each day;
- h. Responsible for overseeing curfew established by the LSC; and
- i. Responsible for making a written report of travel policy or code of conduct violations to USA Swimming's Athlete's Executive Committee, the Committee Meeting Chair, and LSC leadership, in addition to the parent or legal guardian of the subject minor athlete.

Eastern Zone April Board of Directors Report

Spring Championship Review

The Eastern Zone hosted our Short Course Zone Championship meet and our Northern & Southern Sectional Meets in March.

At the May 2012 meeting of the Eastern Zone Delegates, it was decided that the Spring Northern Meet would be a Long Course format and the Southern Meet would be a Short Course format. Previously, the EZ had voted to restrict competition within sections not permitting Northern team to attend Southern meets and Southern Teams to not attend Northern meets. A meeting was called of the Eastern Zone General chairs and a motion was introduced to open the sections to all teams due to the varying of formats offered at the meets. The motion passed 10:1.

In addition to opening the sections within the Zone the decision was also made to restrict the Southern meet and not allow out of Zone teams to attend.

A detailed breakdown of participation in the Sectional meets is attached to this report. In summary, the Southern meet (SC) was fully subscribed, with Eastern Zone teams being turned away. The Northern meet (LC) was a nice size meet.

The Eastern Zone All Star meet was held in Rochester, NY. This meet continues to be a success with many Eastern Zone records being broken (detail attached).

Eastern Zone Spring Meeting

After careful review of the meet formats offered for the Sectional meets within the Eastern Zone, the Zone directors will be proposing the introduction of an additional Sectional (4th) meet to be conducted in earl April. The course format for this meet will be Long Course. Given the number of athletes within our zone (74,000+) we feel that all 3 Spring Sectional meets can be fully supported.

Based on the number of teams wishing to attend the Southern Short Course meet that we were not able to get in, we feel that 2 Short Course format meets (Northern Section & Southern Section) can me fully subscribed. In addition to these meets the Eastern Zone would host a Spring Long Course Sectional meet. The goal for this meet would be 400- 500 swimmers.

This proposal will be presented to the Eastern Zone delegates at our May meeting in Ft. Lauderdale. Should the Zone support this additional meet, the Eastern Zone directors will submit a proposal, in September, to the USA Swimming Board of

Directors requested and additional \$12,500.00 in funding for this meet. With the addition of a 4th Sectional meet in the East, this will bring us in line with number of sectional meets and funding of the other zones within USA Swimming.

Eastern Zone Safe Sport Officer

A proposal has been submitted by Potomac Valley Swimming General Chair for the Eastern Zone to begin working on the introduction of a Safe Sport officer within the Eastern Zone Board. This concept is supported by the Eastern Zone Directors who will be working with the USA Swimming Safe Sport Officer on how best to structure this position within the Zone Board.

Eastern Zone Housekeeping

The Eastern Zone By-Laws and Policy Manuel have undergone a complete reworking over the last 12 months. The final version of these updated documents will be presented to the Eastern Zone at our May meeting. An approved, updated version will be attached to the Eastern Zone September report.

We will once again introduce the concept of an Eastern Zone budget to our delegation in May. Currently, the Eastern Zone does not fund and meets or projects within the Zone. With the introduction of additional programs and meets, it is imperative that the Zone begins to secure funding for these items.
